We are working with the children to help them understand the value of Diversity.

Weekly News from Wren Class - This week in Wren Class, the children were introduced to our new topic We're Going on a Minibeast Hunt. In Muddy Monday, we completed a minibeast hunt without equipment in the school grounds. The children spotted many different species including spiders, flies, and beetles. In the classroom, the children have been busy working together to help create a minibeast investigation role-play area which they love! We have been lucky enough to receive a hornet nest and have learnt many facts about hornets including how they make the hive - from saliva and wood fiber! In phonics, the children have been focusing on CVCC words such as nest, limp, and hand. We have identified vowel sounds within words and used silent blending to read them. In maths, the focus this week was building numbers beyond ten, identifying the number of tens and ones as we did so. Miss Stanley

Weekly News from Robin Class - Robin Class have enjoyed their first week back in school with their friends after the Easter break. They have had great fun starting their new theme in geography learning all about the local area of Bromsgrove and Dodford. We have started to explore what makes it a special place to live. In our English lessons the children have enjoyed using their learning, from last term, about The First Moon Landing to draft some fantastic non-chronological reports about the famous astronaut Neil Armstrong and in our maths lessons we have been investigating odd and even numbers and how to recognise them. Weekly News from Owl Class - Owls have worked extremely hard this week and we are very proud of the way that they have returned to school, full of enthusiasm and creativity. We commenced the week in a creative way by starting our art topic 'Sculptures' with a focus of structural shapes. The children discussed the work of the American sculptor Robert Morris before investigating how they could turn 2D shapes into 3D structures. In science this week we have created our own mini-Earths to demonstrate the water cycle and have been working extremely hard in maths finishing off our fraction unit, calculating equivalent fractions. The current wrap around will continue until the end of term with no changes to the collection time / end times currently in place with families. We are grateful to the support provided by this setting, and we know how much this service helps parents. Therefore, the school is working hard behind the scenes with the governors to recruit staff to run our own in-house wrap around care. We are currently recruiting for a part time admin assistant and a wraparound care lead. We aim to offer both breakfast club and after school care from 7.30am until 6.00pm Monday to Friday.
