Curriculum Spotlight - Design Technology

It seems we have some future designers, architects and engineers at Dodford First! The Children have been talking to Miss Underhill about their learning in Design Technology (DT). Miss Underhill leads this area of the curriculum and has worked hard with the teachers to plan the school's DT curriculum so the children can learn and apply new skills in this subject as they progress through the school.

Here are some of the things the children said about their DT lessons;

Wrens Class – **YR**: We looked at the design projects in the class memory book. Using the photographs to prompt discussion.

'We made paint brushes with sticks and then painted a picture I painted a firework'.

'This is when I was making a robot. I made it out of cardboard and yoghurt pots. I had a box for my body and a box for my head'

Robins Class - Y1 and Y2

'I've learnt that the moon buggies have different features like, flags and satellites.'

'The teacher is helpful. She checks our work and gives advice on what to make better.'

'We were learning about bridges. We needed to make a strong structure and we used sugar cubes to stick them together.'

'I have learnt skills from DT. You can make anything, but you have to try hard.'

Owls Class - Y3 and Y4

'I liked making the soup because we got to eat it. In the soup café!.'We sold the soup to the other year groups and made some money.'

'I think I know how to attach things together and make them more secure.'

'I am proud of my Viking long house. The finished design looks quite good. Sometimes we evaluate with our friends.'

'We were learning about shell structures. A shell structure is like a 3D item that keep something safe inside of it. We used cuboids and a triangular prism.'

'I think my designs are getting better now.'



Our School Values - Week 2 - Diversity

Why is diversity important? Diversity is essential for creating a world where everyone feels safe, included and respected. It is especially important in places such as schools and workplaces, where everyone deserves the same opportunities as everyone else. Diversity helps to improve understanding - for example diversifying the books that we read allows us to understand one another more. If a child reads a book about a festival that is celebrated in a different religion or belief from their own, they will gain a better understanding of a friend who celebrates that festival with their family. This will also give children the opportunity to talk about these differences with each other, allowing them to build a friendship.

No two people are the same, and that is something to be celebrated! At Dodford First School we have a welcoming environment that is respectful of people of all backgrounds.



Weekly News from Wren Class - This week Wren's carried out a minibeast hunt with equipment in the school grounds. They worked in small mixed class groups, and each had a magnifying glass, bug pot, net and identification sheet. The children were excited to find a centipede, millipede, pill woodlouse, butterfly and bumble bee to name just a few! Did you know the brown centipede has 15 pairs of legs, one on each segment of its body? Our key text this week is The Very Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle. The children sequenced the story before creating their own story maps and have used their story maps to retell the story with actions to their friends. We have started to create minibeasts in the style of Eric Carle using paint, paper and tissue paper. We have also listened to and discussed the story St George and the Dragon and watched a short clip of Scouts and Girlguiding organisations on St George's Day Parade. Miss Stanley

Weekly News from Robin Class: On Monday, Robin Class started the week by getting messy in their art lesson. The task was to shape clay using their hands. We had some fantastic 3D models created including snails, snowmen and an ice cream! In our English lessons we have started a new learning sequence all about traditional tales. Our key text this term is The Pea and the Princess by Mini Grey. I have challenged Robins to read traditional tales at home or bring in their favourite fairy tale to share with their friends in our daily Storytime. In our maths we have been learning about money. Pupils had to recognise, sort and order coins and notes. Miss Underhill

Weekly News from Owl Class: Owls have had a busy week! We started by revising our geography skills, using an atlas to start our local area topic. On Tuesday, Owls explored the work of the English sculptor Anthony Caro in DT, in particular the London footbridge he helped to design! The children then worked in small groups to build an abstract sculpture with careful consideration as to how they could join shapes together using various taught strategies. In maths, children in Year 3 have been learning about mass and capacity, reading from scales, and using the terms kilogram and gram. Year 4 has just begun a short unit on decimals. On Wednesday, Year 4 had a fantastic but tiring day learning how to paddle and work as a team on a Bell-boat. We got a little wet but had a fantastic time! Mrs. Eggleton
