Lower Smite Farm Trip

Year 3 and 4 went to Lower Smite Farm on Monday 27th June to learn about rocks and soils. Firstly, we got into groups and we watched a video and we were given clues to find rocks and we found them all. Next, we grouped them and named them, igneous, metamorphic and sedimentary. We were then given Starburst sweets and we made them into sedimentary rocks and then we squashed them into metamorphic rocks. We tried to make some soil and this didn't go well. After lunch we got some soil and squished it into different shapes to figure out what type of soil it was, we also went up a field to see different layers of soil, top soil, sub soil and bedrock, it was amazing!

We dug into the soil to see the different colours and finally we looked at some fossils, Freya in year 3 said "We had a look at fantastic fossils and they were amazing".
