Our focus text: The Gruffalo

On the next pages, you will see our Gruffalo Talk 4 Writing text that children have been learning to retell.

We draw story maps to help children use picture clues to know what words come next, developing fluency in their story telling.

Each day of this isolation pack you will see new words.

Please help your child to read the story off by heart, day by day, recalling more of the story by adding to the words the day before.









Day 1 – The Gruffalo

First – say the following words together to develop familiarity with the key characters, emphasising the starting sound of the words. Here is a link to help to understand how we pronounce letter sounds: <u>Pure Sounds Clip</u>

m (say pure sound) mouse

g (say pure sound) gruffalo

f (say pure sound) fox

Have fun pretending to be the animals whilst saying the starting sound and word!

Talk about the fox and the mouse in the picture.


