Use a recipe from a book then use your fraction knowledge to work out how much you might need if you had to double the recipe. Try out the creation on your parents and ask them to give you feedback. #### ADDITIONAL DAILY LESSONS

If you would like a more structured lesson approach, guided by a teacher then you might like to try the daily Maths, English and /or Foundation lessons provided by The Oak National Academy [www.thenational.academy](http://www.thenational.academy)

These lessons are led by a teacher. There are three lessons for each day of the week. To access visit the website and click classroom, find lesson and then schedule. You can then click on the appropriate year group to access the set daily lessons.

Purple Mash have produced daily lessons covering aspects of English and Maths. Ask your child to log on to Purple Mash and access the age 7-9 Weekly Activities.

There's also a set story in chapters which can be read everyday, with a quiz and a written activity attached.
