What could we do better?

Homework is always a difficult one to judge and has again got a mixed response from some parents. Some feel tasks are too lengthy and there is too much homework, others feel that there isn't enough given. We will again build this into our parent forum evening.

Many of you commented on the improvement of sharing information about your child and their progress within school but there are some parents who would like further feedback on their child's progress throughout the year. The detail and format that this would take will need further consideration and therefore we will build this into our parent forum evening.

One family was concerned about how persistent we are about contacting families when a club is cancelled on the day. Mrs Evans will always send an email informing those parents concerned if a club is cancelled but will also phone the first person on the contact list in the first instance and if the phone isn't answered a message will be left on their voicemail. If a child is still with us at the end of the school day then Mrs Evans will phone the first and second contact on the list. I would advise that parents do check their phones on the days that their child is attending an after school club as unfortunately on rare occasions clubs do have to be cancelled at the last minute. Please also be reassured that your child will be kept safe within school until they are collected if you were not to pick up a message and arrived after the school day had finished.

One family felt that more opportunities were needed to discuss any 'issues.' Any issues personal to one child should always be discussed with the class teacher in the first instance or if they are unavailable then to bring any concerns to the attention of the Head or leave a message with Mrs Evans to arrange a phone call or meeting with the class teacher. Any wider issues can again be brought to the attention of the Head or alternatively raised at the annual parent forum Meeting which is being held this year on Wednesday 9th November at 6.30pm.

Other items have been noted and will either be considered by the school staff or become an agenda item at the parent forum meeting and where appropriate raised with the governors.
