<p>SEASIDE TASK ONE: Have you ever been to the seaside? This week we are going to start thinking about seaside resorts. First let's learn about some unfamiliar words. I would like you to find out what the following words that are coastal features mean: bay, cliff, coastline, beach, pier and lighthouse. You can ask the people in your house, look on the internet or use knowledge from your own experiences. Have you ever seen any of these features yourself?</p>	<p>DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY: Lighthouse challenge, this week I would like you to design and make your own lighthouse.
