<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Using the Purple Mash program, click <u>2do: Pages of a book</u> and write a short story and illustrate. I will provide feedback on this activity. Please type the story yourself so I can see how your phonics skills are progressing. Practise spelling five phase 3 irregular words <i>he</i> and <i>she</i>. Revise all phase 3 spellings you found tricky. The phase 3 irregular words are: <i>he, she, we, me, be, you, are, her, was, all, they, my</i>. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Time - Make your own analogue clock or watch - this can be done on a paint program on the computer, using craft resources, using items from the garden, household items and post it notes etc. Discuss the range of numbers from 1 to 12, the hour, minute and second hands and the way in which they move - clockwise. Extension: Ask your child to move the hands to show a given time. Start with o'clock and then move on to half past. Using what you have to hand to make 1-20 number cards, order them and say one more or one less than any given number. Challenge yourself and see if you can work with numbers beyond 20! Extension: Complete the activity mentally - no resources!
